We're excited to share with our supporters that Inside Out meetings have resumed in person. In late April, our weekly **Community Meetings** on Thursdays transitioned from Zoom to in person. We've also been able to resume our weekly meeting at **Hope House** work release center. We look forward to safely providing these services to our community members once again and thank you to our volunteers who assist with these groups.

COFFEE AND CONNECTIONS

Every Tuesday from 5:30 – 6:30 pm we host a peer-led support group for those in all stages of recovery who have also been involved in the criminal legal system. Inspired by Johann Hari's famous Ted Talk, the group is based on the belief that the opposite of addiction is not sobriety, it is connection. The group meets weekly to share successes, discuss challenges, and show peer support.

WRITING WORKSHOP

On the second and fourth Thursdays of each month from 5:15 – 6:15 pm, we host a writing group for returning citizens of all writing skill levels. The group helps those interested in writing expand their skills, experiment with different styles, and engage in the healing properties of writing. CELEBRATING COMMUNITY THROUGH GARDENING

Inside Out has been very grateful this summer for the opportunity to support our members with a gardening project.
