

COMING TOGETHER AT AN INSIDE OUT FALL DINNER



On Sunday October 2nd, Inside Out members gathered together for our annual Fall dinner. With the warm fall we've had, we were able to set up outside and enjoy the weather. St. Wenceslaus Church graciously provided the meals, which included: turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, and all of the associated fixings. We had nearly 30 members join us for the meal! It was a great chance for members to connect with each other and socialize. Members and staff were all very happy for the opportunity, and the meal received great reviews.

STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS: INCLUDING OUR MEMBERS IN DEVELOPING OUR REENTRY HOUSING

Safe and supportive housing is one of the most important parts of successful reentry, and now we are well on our way toward purchasing a home for our reentry housing program! This home will be a 4-6 bedroom home where residents will start their transition back into the community after incarceration. With fundraising nearly complete, it is our hope to have a house purchased in early 2023.

As part of our preparations, our summer MSW intern, Alison Clark, hosted two impacted stakeholder meetings with Inside Out members. At these meetings, members shared how their own housing situation helped or complicated their return to the community. Members reviewed drafted policies and gave feedback on how to make them stronger.

By directly involving our members in this way, Inside Out will be better prepared to address the unique needs of returning citizens. Thank you to our members who participated in these meetings, and thank you to everyone who has supported us as we get closer to opening a reentry house!



SEEKING MALE MENTORS!

We are currently seeking male volunteer mentors to provide social, emotional, and practical support to a returning citizen. Mentors correspond with an incarcerated individual who will be reentering the community in order to listen, provide non-judgmental support, and offer companionship. Once the individual is released, the mentor continues to provide support during their reentry. Form a meaningful friendship and help a returning citizen overcome barriers, increase their confidence, and reach their goals.

NATURE HIKE AT HICKORY HILL PARK

On a beautiful fall day, Saturday October 15, our community here at Inside Out adventured outdoors for a wonderful Nature Hike. Inside Out members came to hike around Hickory Hill Park for an afternoon of serenity and exploration. We spotted many birds, including nut-hatches, robins, red-bellied woodpeckers, and blue jays. We also identified various plants and mushrooms. Everyone enjoyed the opportunity to get outside while the weather was nice and the leaves were vibrant. Inside Out member Royce remarked that the hike was:

REENTRY HOUSE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN GOAL MET!

In August Inside Out launched the public phase of our Capital Campaign to complete the funding initiative to purchase our first Reentry House, and we are excited to announce that during this fundraising campaign, we raised \$61,938.35 or 124% of our goal. We did it because of you!

A huge thank you to the more than 50 individuals and organizations who contributed to the Capital Campaign in amounts ranging from ten dollars to thousands of dollars, and thanks also to the many community members who donated during the silent phase of the campaign and donated to our Fall 2021 Inside Out Run Home fundraiser. Special thanks to IO Board members, volunteers, and staff who worked hard on the Campaign.



Once we receive the \$100,000 federal HOME grant money through the City of Iowa City, we'll begin looking for a 4-6 bedroom house in earnest. The Housing Trust Fund of Johnson County has pledged interest-free loans of up to \$200,000, with half of that being forgivable after 15 years.

Our original overall target was \$340,000, and we are excited to continue receiving funds for this much needed space. We look forward to the next phase of our Reentry House project!
