INSIDE OUT PURCHASED A HOUSE!

We are glad to announce that we have closed on our Inside Out Reentry House! The six-bedroom house will provide sober, transitional housing with stays up to 24 months for men leaving incarceration. Inside Out will provide on-site case management, mentors, and other services for residents as they get established in the community. A safe and affordable place to call home is so important to successful reentry, and we are grateful to all our donors and funders for helping reach our goal. We are on track to have the house open in early Fall, when there will be an opening reception for major donors and neighbors.

Now we begin the exciting work of remodeling and furnishing the house for our first residents. If you are interested in helping with the reentry house, there are several ways to get involved. If you are the handy type, keep an eye out for chances to help with painting and other projects. We are also looking for volunteers to serve as mentors to residents as a part of their stay in our Reentry House.

INSIDE OUT REENTRY HOUSE: NOW TAKING DONATIONS

The Furnishings Committee is now taking donations of furniture, kitchenware, artwork, and pretty much everything we'll need to furnish Inside Out's new Reentry House. Our main requirement is that everything donated be in excellent condition – nothing extremely worn or at all damaged.

We need to furnish 6 bedrooms with a double/queen bed, bedside table and lamp, dresser, chair, reading lamp, and an end table. There are 3-4 gathering spaces to furnish with sofas, easy chairs, end tables, TV consoles, and lamps. We need an office desk, and could use another couple of computer desks. We're looking for 2 vacuum cleaners, a washer and dryer, a mini-fridge, and microwave. We need small kitchen appliances, cooking utensils, 2-3 sets of dishes, glasses and mugs, and two sets of silverware for the kitchen and kitchenette. And this isn't a complete list!

Please send a photo and description of things you'd like to offer to jefripalermo@gmail.com and someone will get back to you. We can arrange to pick up larger items if needed, usually on the weekend. (Please let us know if you can help with pick-ups!)

In addition to individual donations, we invite churches, civic and other groups to "adopt a room" and donate everything needed for that space. And please pass this information on to others. Thank you!

MENTOR PROGRAM: PROVIDING SUPPORT AND FRIENDSHIP

Inside Out acknowledges that reentry is not an easy process. Our mentoring program aims to provide returning citizens with social, emotional. practical support through and meaningful companionship. Our Inside Out volunteer mentors provide nonjudgemental support for mentees as they navigate their reentry process and achieve their goals. Correspondence, which frequently begins during incarceration, can transition into activities like meeting for coffee or resource connection following release. Friendships take time to build; the mentoring relationship provides opportunity for a mutually beneficial relationship and genuine connection to blossom.
