### **UPCOMING PAROLE SIMULATION - REGISTER TODAY!**




2017 parole simulation

Each year, more than 5,000 citizens return from prison to their communities in Iowa. This transition back into the community comes with significant challenges. During the simulation participants assume the identity of a returning citizen and navigate a series of events to gain an understanding of the obstacles facing individuals upon release from incarceration. Earlier this month we held our second annual *Art From The Inside Out* at Public Space One, a free art show featuring the work of people who have been incarcerated. This event included live music and speeches from artists Reggie Gradstaff and Shawn Lurkens who provided insight on their experiences of creating art while incarcerated.
